
LIVE IN FOOD INSECURE HOUSEHOLDS



IN NIPISSING, ONTARIO WORKS RECIPIENTS WITH NO FIXED ADDRESS IS A STAGGERING **12.3%**.

WHICH IS **5.6% î** HIGHER THAN THE PROVINCE.

NIPISSING FOOD BANK UNIQUE VISITS 2,094 IN 2022 Children 30%



Ontario Works income does <u>NOT</u> cover the cost of **food** and **shelter** let alone other **other necessities**.



Nutritious Food Basket estimates <u>assume</u> that people have the means to store, prepare and cook the foods that are on the list.





What would you choose?

FOOD INSECURITY

Is inadequate or insecure access to food due to financial constraints or worry about not having food to eat.

HARD FACT:

Ontario works rates have **NOT** changed since 2018.

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There are higher rates of
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mental health & physical conditions among those who are food insecure - resulting in premature deaths (dying an average of **9 years** earlier) and costing health care <u>more than **2x**</u> a food secure adult.

Volunteers

The value of the work of volunteers within community food programs is critical to the overall survival of the food security network.
